and Testament of me William Bloxham of Waubury in the County of Oxford Carpenter I give and bequeath unto my dear wife Eleanor Bloxham daughter part of my household furniture linen china and glass as one shall select and retain for the use not absolutely I give devise and bequeath all the rest residue and remainder of my real and personal estate and effects whatsoever and wheresoever and of what nature or kind whatsoever unto my son Richard Bloxham and my friend William Arne of Waubury aforesaid their Executors Administrators and assigns upon trust nevertheless that they said Richard Bloxham and William Arne and their survivors of them and their heirs Executors Administrators and assigns of them do and shall with all convenient speed after my decease sell and dispose of the same real and personal estate either by public auction or private contract for the best price that can be obtained and convey and assure the same premises whosoever to the purchaser or purchasers thereof or as he or they shall direct and I do hereby direct that the purchaser or purchasers of the said premises shall not be obliged to see to the application of the said or their purchase money after paying the same to the said Richard Bloxham and William Arne or their heirs Executors Administrators or assigns and taking their or his receipt shall be a good discharge for all money thereon excepted to be received and I do hereby declare that the said Richard Bloxham and William Arne shall stand possessed of and interested in all and singular the monies to arise from the sale collection and conversion of my said real and personal estate (after payment of my just debts funeral and testamentary expences) upon trust to invest the same in Government or real securities with power to alter the securities as they shall think fit and upon such trust to pay the interest and proceeds of the said trust monies into my said wife for her use and for her life and after her decease in trust to pay the principal of the said trust monies and the stocks funds and securities on which the same shall be placed out and invested into my said son Richard Bloxham for his own use and benefit absolutely provided always and I do hereby direct that neither of my Trustees shall be answerable for the default of them or for the arrears or defaults of the other of them nor for involuntary losses nor for money returned under receipts in which they shall join only for conformity and that my said Trustees shall and may reimburse themselves and each other out of the said trust monies or out of any monies which may come into their hands by virtue of these presents all costs and expences to be incurred by them in the execution of the trusts aforesaid or any wise in relation thereto and I appoint the said Richard Bloxham and William Arne joint Executors of this my Will and I declare that it shall be lawful for my Executors to pay any debts claimed from my Estate upon my Oath if they shall think proper to admit and to adjust settle compromise and compound all accounts reckonings transactions matters and things depending at the time of my decease between me and any other persons persons whatsoever in which words of I the said William Bloxham the Testator have subscribed my hand and seal this twenty third day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty seven.
